Mr. Hiatt graduated with honors from Harvard University in 1973. He received his J.D. from the University of Hawai'i at Manoa, William S. Richardson School of Law in 1977 under a grant from the University of Hawai'i seast—West Center. During Mr. Hiatt final year of law school, he attended Harvard Law School and was selected as an editor of the Harvard Environmental Law Review.
